# Lord of All or not at All

### BE SMART, BE SAFE

Yesterday I attended a professional development workshop with other Principals in Edmonton Public School. One aspect of our conversation was to identify how greatly our society (and culture) has changed in the last 10 years. Needless to say I felt *old* (and many others did too) when we realized that recent literature indicates that some of our "normal" technological and communication resources/devices are considered *obsolete* in this new decade to come. Some items deemed obsolete included records, overhead projectors, corded telephones, fax machines, CDs, movie rental stores, palm pilots, film in cameras, telephone books, 411, paper maps, dictionaries, encyclopedias, etc. I am sure that many of you STILL use some of the above – they are on the obsolete list.

Instead, as we head into the 2<sup>nd</sup> decade in this century, there are numerous new communication and learning devices. These include cell phones that do most anything you want them to do, Smart Boards (which are only smart if the operator knows what he/she can do), iPods, wireless computers of all shapes/sizes and capabilities, endless access to instant communication, email, Web sites, Internet users, etc. (there is a long list of newer forms of communication).

Connected to these numerous changes comes the increasing concern for user safety! The safety and privacy of the user can easily be lost. To "be safe" owners and users are required to have a certain degree of training or awareness of appropriate usage.

With many of these devices, it is not easy to know with whom your children are "talking". Friends are one thing, but online people often use aliases and aren't always truthful about who they are. It is essential that parents dialogue with their children (supervise/teach them regularly) to ensure they are aware of the risks and take proper precautions. **Do you know how to control these new experiences and place restrictions when necessary?**

We want all our children to be safe and be critical thinkers. They need to learn to understand, evaluate and choose from right and wrong. We need to teach them how to be smart and safe.
